¹ * Students are obliged to pass an exam in a foreign language (meaning not his native language or an official language of his country of residence) on the B1 level on the 3rd (last) year of BA programme. You can find language classes offered by university taught in English up to the level A2 teaching French, Italian, German, Spanish, Russian and Polish, from the B1 level all courses are only taught in the language students are learning (so they will not be taught in English or Polish, and they will not be listed in system as courses taught in English, nonetheless English speaking students can easily attend them). A student has to pass B1 exam to pass the 3rd year of BA, the exam DOES NOT need to be the language learnt during classes. If a student has acquired language certificates and/or has grades obtained outside the University of Warsaw they need to be presented to Director of the Centre for Foreign Language Teaching who will decide if it will suffice in the place of internal university exam.
