




1822 The fifth child of Neubukow vicar.

1823 Move to Ankershagen.

1833-36 A school in Neustrelitz.

1836-41 Apprentice in a shop in Fürstenberg.

1842-46 Catastrophe of a ship; assistant and bookkeeper Schröder&Co. in Amsterdam; Foreign languages learning.

1846 Company's representative in Petersburg.

1847 Foundation of his own company, great business.

1850-52 California, different businesses.

852 Married to Ekaterine Petrowna Liszin

1854-59 Crimean War, good business.

1858-59 Travel to Italy, Egypt, Syria, Palestine and Spain.

1864 Liquidation of the company, beginning of research

1864-66 Travel to Far East, Cuba and America

1866-70 Studies at Sorbonne

1867 Publication of a book on China and Japan

1867-68 Travel to America and Cuba

1868 Travel to Greece and Italy (Ithaca, Mycenae, Troy)

Decision to became an archaeologist, Ph.D. at Rostock University (the description of his travel to Greece); divorce in Indianapolis; ;married to Sofia Kastromenou (2 children: Andromacha and Agamemnon).

1870 Settlement in w Athena; the first research in Troy.

1871-73 Excavations in Troy (1873 – Priam's Treasure).

1874 Publication of Troy; excavations in Mycenae.

1876 Excavations in Tiryns; excavations in Mycenae (the Circle A)

1878-79 Troy (with Virchow)

1880-81 Orchomenos

1882 Troy with Wilhelm Dörpfeld

1883 Marathon, Termopylai; visit to Knossos

1884 Marathon (the tumulus)

1884-85 Tiryns with Dörpfeld.

1886 Orchomenos

1888 Travel with Virchow to Egypt, search of Alexander's tomb

1890 Troy; ear surgery; death in Naples.
