The course should show what traces were left in the archaeological material by various historical, social and cultural processes.</p> <p>The main themes to be discussed: State and society: royal ideology, the formation of the state, administration, crises of the state; religion: theological systems - Heliopolitan and Hermopolitan, divine triads; writing and literature: major religious text corpora- Pyramid Texts, Coffin Texts, Book of the Dead. Beginnings of literature; visual arts: sculpture, painting, relief. Canon of art; various types of artefacts as sources of information on different aspects of Egyptian civilisation.</p> <p>During the complete course two separate methods of teaching will be applied for lecture and class.</p> <p>During the lectures course the word method (lecture) will be used, complemented with visualization of the subject matter of the course in the form of presentation / film (visual method), aimed at presenting knowledge and its assimilation.</p> <p>Classes will be carried out by acquainting students with the basic issues concerning material culture and the state and quality of scientific literature regarding the issues discussed. The content will be presented in the form of a presentation illustrating different ways of argumentation (in the historical perspective, i.e. from the most ancient publications to contemporary studies, including the development of eristic methods), as well as outline the limitations and research possibilities in the subject matter discussed. The development of the Mesopotamian urban civilisations from Sumerians to the Macedonian conquest will be discussed in chronological order. So-called peripheral regions, such as Anatolia, Syro-Palestine (Levant) and Iran with</p>												

	<p>their own archaeology and history will also be important subjects during the course. The lecture is planned to end with a presentation of the archaeology, political history and cultural situation in the Middle East during the Roman and Byzantine periods.</p> <p>The main themes to be discussed: geography, climate and natural resources as a background for the development of ancient Middle Eastern cultures; beginnings of the civilisation – first states in the Middle East (mainly the Uruk Period); great cultures of the 3rd Millennium. The Early Dynastic Period in Mesopotamia, the Akkad Empire, Anatolia, Syria and Susiana in the Early Bronze Age; “The World is changing” – Amorites in Mesopotamia and Syria, the Hittite Old Kingdom; Late Bronze Age world. The Hittite Empire, Hurrians, Syro-Palestine, Elam, Kassite Babylonia and the first Assyrian Empire; Iron Age Empires: Assyria, Babylonia, Media, Achaemenid Persia; Around the Great Empires. Levantine, Syro-Palestine, the Neo-Hittite state, Urartu; Late Iron Age cultural and social changes – Achaemenid Persia’s universalism. Persian relations with the Mediterranean World. Program content will be implemented within conversational classes using short oral statements and preparation of presentations in order to acquire basic skills in acquiring information and creating a coherent scientific message.
