
USOSweb – an electronic system for students

- USOSweb is a system that in many cases provides access to information that was formerly available only in the Dean's Office: courses schedule, grades, information about courses and lecturers
- USOSweb in many situations helps students avoid the need to appear in the Dean's Office: allows sending applications to the dean, scholarship applications, fill out surveys, payments, student exchange, etc.

Token registration

• Registration to some courses requires a virtual currency called tokens. These courses are, as a rule, open to all students at the University of Warsaw, irrespective of their field of study or specialisation.

 On-line registration using tokens is obligatory for all the general university courses [OGUNs], foreign language courses and examinations, PE courses and for courses required to be awarded a teaching qualification. Students must enrol by themselves, and ONLY via the USOS.




Linkage - committing to a course

- Linking in is the equivalent of the old entry of the object into the paper index
- Each student who finishes a cycle of studies and wants to get an entry for the next stage must take care of indicating which subjects they have passed within a given study programme, which of them are to be taken into account when finishing a given cycle, and which are extracurricular subjects.
- If a student studies in one program, the connection to the program is added automatically during registration !!!

- You can link courses yourself only to the current cycle!
- You really have to keep an eye on it the attached item = the item required to be passed!
- There is no connection = there is no credit!
- Resignation from completing classes is possible only on dates set by the academic calendar!
- Unlinking from the program by application to the dean!

Representatives and solving up problems

- Students are adults and therefore, deal with matters in person
- In the case of the so-called higher necessity, the matter for the student can be settled by the direct family with clear authorisation from the student, provided by the interested party himself.
- Even the immediate family is not given information about the student without his consent (GDPR!)
- Any other person must present a notarial authorisation


 In the Reading Room you can scan books and magazine articles free of charge with the librarians' consent.






The library warehouses

- We also store old forms and diploma theses in our warehouses.,








The library warehouses - old forms


 Our main catalog where you can find a specific book is the computer catalog located on the website of the University of Warsaw Library (BUW) - www.buw.uw.edu.pl.
